### **Member of the Month**

### Dawn King, Newsletter Editor (starting with January 2022 NL)



Dawn King is a person who enjoys anonymity, while she pushes from behind, assisting individuals and non-profit organizations to realize their dreams. Dawn won awards for her art and writing, starting in grade school. In her early twenties she moved to a small writers and artists community on the Mediterranean island of Mallorca where she began helping famous authors edit and prepare manuscripts for publication. She says "I started at the top, working with a writer for National Geographic, an Editor of Britain's Queen Magazine, and the then poet laureate of England, Robert Graves, as well as an American writer whose novel I assisted with and it became a NYTimes Best Seller for many weeks."

Dawn has designed and created her own and other's clothing, and sold her fiber arts: spinning, weaving, quilting, and more. Her family members had art careers, so art and painting are part of her DNA. In 1987 while living in Nevada, Dawn bought one of the first Mac computers and a laser printer, and started her own publishing business. She created a logo for a city, menus and advertising pieces for local casinos, including

many hand-colored posters, and a six-foot overhead airplane.

In 1996, Dawn and her husband moved to a ranch near Santa Barbara. There she has continued to create publications for non-profits and others, designing and editing numerous books and their covers for self-publishing authors. "One of the most fun," she says, "was a memoir for Berkley art professor Karl Kasten. He included a humorous little sketch on every piece of mail."

Dawn says, "Everything interests me, so it's been wonderful to work on books covering an array of topics from yoga, to botanical i.d., to a self-help medical book. I'm very detail oriented—a necessity in typesetting, and good editing—that carries over to my artistic expression. And big projects don't scare me; I've even created extensive book indexes manually.

But when Covid started, I decided to retire from computer work and create art with my hands. Textile design had been calling me, but today it usually requires computers. Soon I took on a large acrylic painting project—wallpaper art—that's currently taking its time progressing. I look forward to trying clay, which I loved many years ago, mosaics, calligraphy, block printing, and you-name-it. My sweet mother (almost 102 years old) passed away at the end of 2020 from heart congestion—she had lived with us for 12 years—so now I have more time to play."

My husband and I love hiking, camping, backpacking, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, photography, botanizing, bird-watching, singing and making music, as well as volunteering for inspiring non-profits. So, looks like I'm going to be helping GVAA for a while, which it is my honor to do so. Members are so talented, and have been so generous and welcoming.

# **Tips & Techniques**

## **Watercolor Techniques**



GOOD ADVICE Use a lot of juicy, concentrated pigment. If your paintings are dull and lighter than you want them to be, you need to use more paint. If you want brighter paintings, make sure you're using a well of dissolved pigment and begin with a strong value (close to 100 percent). Wet one section of the painting, or one petal at a time, with clear water and then let the pure pigments mingle on the paper. Tipping the paper will help with the mixing of pigments.

The above tip is from Kathleen Alexander, Watercolor Artist, as part of her article 'The Road to Realism' published in Watercolor Artist Magazine, Summer 2021.

He also invites you to bring 3-5 completely dry unframed oil paintings for him to critique. With your permission, he will ask you to photograph your painting and put a retouch varnish on it to bring up the colors as they were when wet and make changes to the painting as if it were his own, illustrating how you can achieve a better painting. Then he will ask you to photograph the painting again. At this point you will have the choice to either keep it as a learning lesson or remove what Albert painted and try to paint with Albert's help at the easel. It is a very good learning lesson for one and all.

County Planning and Development, the County Sustainability Division, and the Office of Arts & Culture invite artists of all practices living in county unincorporated areas in this new call for art expressing what environmental justice means to them. Three selected artists will receive a \$500 honorarium, and two youth artists will be awarded \$250 scholarships as part of this initiative. All artists submitting work may have the opportunity to showcase work in County media, documents, and policy platforms.

The County is creating an Environmental Justice Element and hopes to partner with local artists to help expand community understanding and awareness of environmental and climate issues. The purpose of this showcase is to create an opportunity for community members to share their perspectives and experiences living in Santa Barbara County. Themes could include air, water, transportation, utilities, housing, food access, and recreation as they relate to justice or injustice.

Environmental justice is defined as the fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of land use and environmental laws, regulations, and policies.



This will be a non-juried exhibition, outdoors at La Cumbre Plaza where locals and tourists will be gathering to eat and shop for holiday gifts. If you would like to be a part of this exciting event, here are some guidelines for you to be thinking about...

#### TGVAA will provide:

- Art panels
  - o Two panels, one side, is \$35.
  - o Two panels, two two sides, is \$70.
  - Each artist may reserve a maximum of one two-sided (\$70) panel.
  - o If reserving a double one-sided panel, you may choose a panel partner to utilize the panel's other side ahead of time (be sure to tell us who).
  - o Panels measure 38"wide X 60" or 72" high so plan to display art that fits within these dimensions. **You may** choose the height on the application and your request will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.
- You are welcome to bring a bin for prints, and a table for crafts, cards, bookmarks, etc.
- Table tops MUST be covered in red, green or white. Not necessary to drape to the ground.
- You may bring an umbrella and stand. Umbrella must be a solid color—no prints/advertising.
- If you have panels and a table, they will be set up together.
- One chair will be provided per artist unless a second chair is requested for a helper.

#### **Artists:**

- Fill out and submit the Artist Application attached.
- If you choose to have someone help you, GVAA will provide an extra chair as noted above. You will need to provide this information on the application at the time you reserve your panel(s).
- Participants then will have ample time to hang their art/set up their craft tables before the show opens at 11 a.m.
- Participants should plan to stay after the show closes to help take down panels, etc.

#### **Commission**

• A 25% commission will be deducted from sales to cover the cost of the plaza and advertising of the show.
