President's Message

There have been many changes at the Goleta Library in the past few months. The walls in the multi-purpose room and the West Wall have been refurbished and look great. However, as you may know, the library is now accepting applications from other organizations for the use of the multi-purpose room as well as the West Wall. Hence we were only able to book for the months of January, March. April and June so far this year.

The good news is that our application to have a GVAA art show for August, October, November and December have been accepted and we will have an exhibit and critique as previously scheduled. Please check our newsletter and website for the exact dates. This also means that shows for the West Wall can only be scheduled for the months of April, June, August, October, November and December. The fees have been increased as anticipated for the use of multi-purpose room. However, we did not anticipate that the fees for the use of the West Wall would also be substantially increased. This was a decision made by the City of Santa Barbara Public Library System and not by our local branch in Goleta. As of July 2014, the fees for the use of the West Wall will be \$100 a month. Since we were not given that detail at the time of our application, the library has offered a discount of \$50 a month for the months of August, October, November and December. The Board of Directors has agreed to pay these fees for the year 2014. This also means that when the GVAA is not

having an exhibit in the multi-purpose room, there will not be an exhibit on the West Wall either. I understand this might be upsetting to many of you and we are talking with Bonnie Schreiner and Karen Schroeder, managers of the West Wall, to come up with an amicable solution. Any West Wall questions should be directed to Bonnie and / or Karen.

The Board also recommends that for 2015, individuals could schedule their own show directly with the library, as our income does not allow us to pay \$100 per month for use of the West Wall. Applications will be accepted by the library starting May 1, 2014 until June 15, 2014.

The Board has been very busy in the last few months looking at different ways to increase our membership, dealing with the restoration at the library, and examining our by-laws. It is time to make a few changes to our by-laws and we will keep our members apprised of any changes made. We are also looking at a new way to invigorate the annual Festival of Arts at Stow House in Goleta. Stay tuned for upcoming news via our newsletter or come to our next critique in April.

The show dates have changed for our nonjuried show at TVSB Gallery, 329 Salinas St., SB to August 5 through Nov 1, 2014, details to follow.

On a more personal note, I wish to thank all of you for your kind healing thoughts and your offer to help after I had an accident walking with my dog on the trails of the Maria Ignacio Creek. I have almost completely recovered and I am doing well.




