Bio for August Juror Rick Garcia

Rick Garcia, an award-winning Santa Barbara based oil painter has been painting the California central coast since the mid 1990's but his inspiration harkens back to a much earlier time. Born in 1953, he spent his early years soaking up the beauty of the back country near his grandparent's ranch in Sebastopol California. The memory of those undeveloped vistas is still a strong influence in his work. Relying on his love of nature, his interest in the California Plein Air movement as well as his many years in commercial art Rick has created a blend that is his own unique vision. He graduated from UC Berkeley with a Bachelor of Arts in 1977 and received his formal art training at California College of Arts and Crafts in Oakland Ca. (1979-1982). For 15 years Rick had been a nationally renowned illustrator and art director during which he and his design firm Garcia, Bickmore and Brown were winners of over 20 Addy awards. In the late 1990's he started the transition to a full-time career as a painter, the culmination of years of work in the arts. Rick has taught at the University of California in Santa Barbara, from 1989 to 1994, as a Graphic Design Instructor in the Extension Program. Also, at the Arts Fund Mentorship Program in Santa Barbara California 2003, and S.C.A.P.E. in 2009 he taught a workshop on glazing techniques. From 1983-2000, Rick was owner and partner in three different design/advertising firms specializing in custom design/illustration work. Clients included Clarke American, Disney, Budweiser, American Express. One of his great accomplishments was winning Best of Show 1989 American Advertising Federation amongst numerous other awards.
