### A Message From Our President

As I prepare to write the President's letter for August, I contemplate the fact that once again, the Central Coast has been visited with a catastrophe. This is the third time in about eight

months that extreme events have taken place and left a devastating mark on us.

Fire raged in our area last Friday evening, this time in Goleta. Today is Monday and according to the news, the fire is 90 percent contained. The assessment is that the fire destroyed 13 homes and 15 outbuildings, including barns, workshops and sheds. Thankfully there were no fatalities.

Some of our artist colleagues and friends have been directly affected. Others who were in the vicinity and direct path of the fire were spared by some miracle.

Everyone I've spoken to in both our artist and civic communities, has been deeply affected by the fire and the losses incurred. Whether or not we have had immediate losses ourselves, or even were in direct danger, we all feel vulnerable and at risk. So much of our area is subject to fire at any time of the year. It could happen to any of us.

It is hard to know what to say or do for someone who has had the losses. I notice how much we all want to do something, rush to help, come up with a plan. I think it is a need to relieve our own anxieties and vulnerabilities. Yet sometimes the person most affected does not want that action to take place. Sometimes folks with major losses need time to process and absorb the loss before they can move forward and be open to assistance.

I am learning that the best way to support someone in this place is to let them know I love and care for them and am available for whatever support they will need as time goes on. I also pray for everyone's safety as we move forward and ask for blessings on us all.

I turn to John O'Donohue's Book of Blessings and I read that when a blessing is invoked, a window opens in eternal time:

"Our longing for the eternal kindles our imagination to bless. Regardless of how we configure the eternal, the human heart continues to dream of a state of wholeness, a place where everything comes together, where loss will be made good, where blindness will transform into vision, where damage will be made whole, where the clenched question will open in the house of surprise, where the travails of a life's journey will enjoy a homecoming. To invoke a blessing is to call some of that wholeness upon a person now."





# Ingathering and Hanging: Saturday, Sept. 22, 2018. Show time: 11 am -5 pm. Take down: 5-6 pm.

All participants are responsible for hanging and taking down their work. Please do not remove work before 5 pm.

2. You will receive your booth assignment with your confirmation. Booth artists set up their booths from 8-9am.

#### Panel artists select and hang their panels from 9 – 10:30 am.

\*\*GVAA provides pegboard hooks for the panels but artists may wish to purchase their own. \*\*Artists showing works under glass will have priority for shaded panels, although shade cannot be guaranteed.

\*\*Artists may drive up to sales area to unload their art and immediately drive out to the parking lot behind Stow House before setting up. Please be as efficient as possible as others will be coming along right after you. Please do not block the driveway with cars, artwork or other supplies.

\*\*Artist name tags and panel name tags will be available to label your panels, bins and booths. You may supply your own business cards and artist statement/resume.

Art labels will be provided to be used as sales slips. Label all artwork as appropriate with:

Sales by Panel artists will be handled by GVAA cashiers, with 20% of sales to GVAA. Booth artists handle their own sales.
