President's Message



When I come into our ingatherings and see the wild and crazy collection of artwork in different media, color choices, and styles, I can't imagine how anyone can make sense of the confusion. But our hanging team, Joyce Berger, Filiberto Lomeli and Rosalie Bier, work their mag-

ic at every show. When I see our show hanging, I see each artwork in a new and exciting way and experience the whole show as a work of art in itself. I've asked them to share some of their thoughts with us.

"We try at each show to make a professionally presented exhibit of the paintings deemed by a judge to be worthy of a show. Arranging and displaying individual pieces into a cohesive and artful whole is what we do.

In choosing what goes where, we consider size, and try to have a large piece on each wall as a focal point in the shape of the display on that wall. Next we look for hues that repeat in paintings or in the colors of frames. Value and a clustering of subject matter may also be used to organize the hanging.

Since the front wall is what we look at during the critique, we usually start with that space, and put the boldest pieces there. Sometimes the combinations go together easily, other times it is a struggle to find 'neighbors' for pieces with unusual frames or intense colors.

I would like to add that we do NOT consider the name of the painter while we are assembling the show. We work well together as a team and we certainly enjoy it. Why don't you give hanging a show a try?" Joyce and Rosalie remind us of the following guidelines.

"When we paint a scene at our favorite location or of a favorite person or subject, we want to present it in a manner that enhances what we have painted."

- Oils and acrylics with painted edges may be unframed.
- Artworks on paper must be covered with clean glass or Plexiglas or sealed with several layers of acrylic sealer or spray appropriate to your work.
- Mats should be carefully cut and free of smudges and dirt. Neutral colors, whites and off-whites, show most artwork at their best and don't distract from the art.
- Frames should be free from damage and should enhance your work and not overwhelm or distract from it.
- Please wire your work so that the painting will hang without showing the nails we use, placing the back screw-eyes about 4 or 5 inches from the top of your work.
- Make sure the wire is attached firmly across the back and that the ends of the wires are pulled back to the eye-screws and wrapped with tape—those wire ends hurt!
- Ask yourself if you would be proud to have a buyer see the back of your painting. Is it neatly finished and/or covered with brown paper? Or does it show careless finishing, unattractive cardboard backing or masking tape?"




