

President's Message

I retired to paint and play the cello. It's been inspiring and educational for me to note the ways that these two art forms are similar. Much has been written about how to practice an instrument effectively, and I'm finding the same is true in making art. Here's what I notice.

Warming up. In music, I may warm up by playing scales or by playing a favorite piece very slowly and mindfully, listening for perfect intonation. In art, we warm up with quick timed sketches or as Skip Lawrence demonstrated in a workshop, mapping out sections on a large sheet of paper and composing multiple compositions of the same subject. How else do you warm up?

Make every note beautiful. It doesn't matter if I am playing scales or practicing the hard parts of a new piece, be intentional about making every note beautiful. Isn't the same thing true with our brushstrokes or collage material? Make every stroke beautiful and in response to what else is happening in the work.

Repeat the hard parts. A friend happened to be staying at the same hotel as a famous violin-


ist and could hear her practicing for a concert. The violinist practiced sections until she could play them perfectly fifty times...not as I often do, fifty times incorrectly until I get it right once! What are the areas that we struggle with in our art and how often do we go back until we get it right; until we truly understand the shape of the flower, the perspective on the building, the expression in the eye of our subject, the way two colors work together?

Practice every day...and then don't! The great cellist Rostropovich used to say, if I miss one day of practice, I can tell; if I miss two days, my wife can tell; if I miss three days, the whole world can tell. Well, I'm no Rostropovich but when I play or paint daily, I'm so pleased with

my progress. When I don't, I forget rules and techniques that I thought I had down...And when we've been working hard on somethina. it's important to take a break, to vacate the studio and let the process incubate for a while. I find I come back refreshed and renewed.


