Message From Our President

I've been working the last few weeks to prepare for the GVAA Artist Tour scheduled for Saturday, May 19^{th.} The tour probably will have happened by the time you read this. Right now, I'm working hard to be ready. There is nothing like a

deadline to spur my creative energies and juices.

The tour should be fun as it is a chance to meet and talk to friends, fans and fellow artists. It is also a wonderful learning experience and a great way to find out art-wise what people are interested in and what they will buy.

Last newsletter I wrote about my love of color – how I crave it and enjoy it. How much fun it is to play with color.

Now I am having just as much fun painting in black, white and shades of gray. I am learning how images in black and white with touches of gray are stark and powerful. Color, as much as I love it, can be a distraction. Working with a simpler palette forces me to be more aware of composition, lines, spaces between objects and shadows. Each piece I have done has taught me something important. I am learning so much as I go.

It has been interesting as well to read about the importance of black and white in art since ancient times.

John O'Donohue in "Beauty The Invisible Embrace" writes that, "black is the primal source from which everything emerged. Darkness withholds presence and deepens the mystery". He writes further that "It is fascinating to consider that ancient kinship of light and dark, white and black. White light always shapes the darkest shadow. Indeed the shadow is the child of the threshold where black and white

converge."

The wonderful thing for me, is to be able to discover this as I paint in black and white. These words and concepts become a real experience as I create my faces using white and black. It is so powerful to see the way the lower lip shows the light, while the upper lip is in shadow as is the space below the lip. It is fascinating to see how the cheek can reflect light while shadows lurk just under the eye and nose. The dark areas allow for the light to shine forth. Gray areas enhance the lines and bones of the face as well as creating varying shades of darkness.

From another source on the Internet, Lori McNee's Art and Fine Art Tips, I read that gray colors create a sense of peace for the viewer. Black is the symbol of grief and can have a morbid feeling. Black can also be dignified and represent sophistication. White represents youth and innocence but too much of it can give a clinical feeling. I have just read that in many Eastern cultures, white signifies death, mourning and unhappiness. I did not know this.

So much to learn as I grow as an artist. It is so deeply satisfying to be absorbing all this and applying it at the same time, especially at this stage of my life. Once again, I am grateful for this profound and life enhancing gift.

White Line Woodcut Workshop



GVAA Artist Karen Schroder will be teaching a White **Line Woodcut Workshop** exclusively for GVAA artists on Saturday, June 9 10am - 2pm. This is a technique that began in Massachusetts during the early 20th century. It was started by a group of artists who wanted to do printmaking but had few materials and no press. A line is carved into a block of wood, watercolor is painted on the block and paper is rubbed onto the block to create the image. Please look up "Provincetown Printers", or White Line Woodcut on line for more information. Prints are usually small. You will need to bring: an x-acto knife and watercolors. Other materials are provided. Fee \$25, that includes \$10 for the class and \$15 materials. Paid directly to Karen Schroder on the day of the workshop. Deadline to enroll by May 25.
