## A Message From Our President

"Does what goes on inside show on the outside?" a 26-year-old Vincent Van Gogh wrote to his brother Theo in his letter about his struggle for artistic purpose and recognition. I can relate. How do I express my inner fire/vision/struggle

so others can see?

Luckily for us, Vincent and his brother had a voluminous correspondence which has been preserved. In it, we can get a sense of the profound human struggle Vincent was engaged in as an artist and human being. He struggled just to physically survive in a difficult world and also to stay on his path as an artist no matter how little validation he received from his family or the community at large.

"Someone has a great fire in his soul and nobody ever comes to warm themselves at it, and passers-by see nothing but a little smoke at the top of the chimney. So now what are we to do, keep this fire alive inside, have salt in ourselves, wait patiently, but with how much impatience, await the hour, I say, when whoever wants to, will come and sit down there, will stay there, for all I know?"

It is ironic to read of Vincent's wondering if anyone would ever come to warm themselves at his creative fire's paintings and drawings, when today he is considered the most recognized artist in the world. People everywhere are familiar with and in love with his work. Yet, in his time, as he created, as he lived his life, he was tortured with doubt.

How can we relate to this? What inspiration or lesson is there for us to learn? I find it so helpful to know that Vincent also wrote: "On the road that I'm on I must continue; if I do nothing, if I don't study, if I don't keep on trying, then I'm lost, then woe betide me. That's how I see this, to keep on, keep on, that's what's needed."

He was considered by some an idler, lazy, lost, good for nothing. He did not have clarity on his goals. He did not have a life plan. He responds to this criticism:

"But what's your ultimate goal, you'll say. The goal will become clearer, will take shape slowly and surely, as the croquis becomes a sketch and the sketch a painting, as one works more seriously, as one digs deeper into the originally vague idea, the first fugitive, passing thought, unless it becomes firm."

He talks about being in a prison of despair of loss of hope and encouragement. He finds what makes the prison disappear:

"You know, what makes the prison disappear is very deep, serious attachment. To be friends, to be brothers, to love; that opens the prison through sovereign power, through a most powerful spell. But he who doesn't have that remains in death. But where sympathy springs up again, life springs up again."

I relate wholeheartedly to Vincent's struggles and observations in every way. I have always loved his art since I was a child and can honestly say, he was the first artist whose work deeply moved me. I can still remember looking at a copy of "Starry Night" for the first time when I was 10. I had a visceral reaction as if punched in the gut. I had never reacted to any piece of art like that before. It was a revelation of what art could be.

In all his pieces, his deep humanity and love always comes through. I never tire of his art. I am grateful that he persevered as an artist.

I'm so grateful for all my connections in our art world here in Goleta/Santa Barbara. The friendships and encouragement I have received through GVAA, SBCC/CLL, SBAA and other art organizations has uplifted me in my life as an artist and human being.
