A Message From Our President

As I write this letter, I am dealing with the fact that Thanksgiving is right around the corner and then Christmas and the end of 2018. This is both sobering and hard to believe. Last week we fell backwards and landed in the time of the year

when the days turn dark earlier in the evenings. Oftentimes, so does my mood.

I am looking at all the things to express gratitude for, and there are many. GVAA has had a wonderful year and there is much to celebrate!!

Way back in May of this year, we had our Artist Tour. Many of our biggest fans and art lovers showed up and purchased items from their favorite GVAA artists which made for a very successful tour. As the Board has decided that this is an every other year event, we will not be hosting the tour in 2019, but there are several ideas being touted for the 2020 Artist Tour.

We are also grateful for the \$1,000 grant which GVAA has been awarded by the City of Goleta to support our Stow House Art Festival for the second year in a row. Deep thank you to the City of Goleta and GVAA's V.P. Terre Sanitate who secured the grant. Over 600 fans attended our festival and enjoyed the day. In terms of sales, this turned out to be our second most successful festival ever. From a financial viewpoint, the participating artists and artisans alike had a prosperous day.

More gratitude for all the merchants who donated items for our raffle at Stow House as well as all the generous folks who bought raffle tickets. We raised over \$700 which goes in the pot for the GUSD's Art After School Program. The board voted to add \$1300 to the \$700, so we were able to donate a total of \$2,000 for art supplies. This is the most ever we have donated.

A very deep thank you to the GVAA artists who go into the schools each month and teach an art lesson to the kids. This is the third year GVAA has participated in this program and it is much appreciated by the kids, parents and teachers. It has been a huge hit!! Thank you to **Judy Edmondson** for coordinating our participation with GUSD. GVAA artist and former

teacher/principal Tia Blickley kicked off this year's program in October with an art project centered around leaves. The art the kids produce in these sessions always amazes me and this is no exception. Check out the photos from this lesson which are included further on this newsletter.

Much gratitude also to our generous GVAA artists who participated in our Marketing Workshop way back in February. Carol Dixon, Holly Hungett and Judy Nienow shared their secrets for successfully selling their artistic wares. Thanks too to Karen Schroeder for teaching her wonderful White Line Woodcut Workshop to 14 lucky GVAA members back in June. We are also grateful for Christina Ramos of Golden Products who offered a free demo workshop to GVAA members in April.

Christina will be back with us on Saturday, November 17th to give the 6 hour Golden Surfaces Workshop for 15 of us. The workshop is full and we are all looking forward to it.

Thank you to **Linda Look** who is coordinating our Picassos for Peanuts reception which is coming up on December 1st. Bring your art in to hang on November 30th – there is no juror. All items should be priced at \$300 or less. Look further in the newsletter for more details. Oils are recommended for this course, but pastellists and acrylicists are also welcome. Gaye will be working in oils. The focus of this course is to introduce those beginning in Plein Air to the basic skill sets required to produce a successful field sketch, and to further the learning and skill sets of those with more experience. Learning to design from what is in front of you, simplifying and developing a process for recording the most changeable elements quickly and accurately, and completing the painting in one sitting is where the focus of the course will lie.
