In September we celebrated our 14th Annual Stow House Art Festival. This year, I must say we had perfect weather at our perfect location. Thank you to the weather gods.

For years we have been saying that over 200 people

attend our festival annually. This year, GVAA V.P., Terre Sanitate decided to have volunteers posted at the entrance to the festival with a clicker to actually count each person who entered. At the end of the festival, our clicker showed that over 600 people had attended!!! Who knew?? Over the years, with people coming and going all day long and our festival being held in such a beautiful, spacious outdoor setting, it never felt crowded, and as though that many folks were attending. Thank you Terre – you rock!! Special thank you to the volunteers who welcomed folks and clicked all day long.

Additional thanks to Terre for organizing and overseeing all the details of the festival; to Carol Dixon who handled the enrollments of the 35 artists and artisans who participated and to Heidi Bratt who developed our post card, newspaper ads and festival brochure which was given to all who entered. Heidi also set up our raffle table which looked inviting and festive. Thank you to GVAA artist K.J. Borgman for your wonderful and award winning image of the train and depot and for providing a print which was a highly coveted raffle prize.

The festival was one of our most successful. Thanks to GVAA Treasurer, Marie Arnold for getting the accounting done so quickly. The raffle raised \$705 which is the most ever!! The GVAA board will be meeting this week and deciding how much to add to this sum for the full donation to the GUSD Art After School program. This money goes to buy art supplies for the students. Several of our GVAA artists will go in to the schools to deliver an art lesson using the supplies. We will share photos of the children's art in subsequent newsletters. Thank you to all the volunteers who sold raffle tickets.

Our festival booth Artisans had their second highest sales ever at \$3419 and our Artist Sales were also second highest ever at \$3260 for total sales of \$6679!! All in all a wonderful, productive, successful day. Thank you to all our volunteer cashiers.

Everyone attending seemed to have a great time. I heard lots of compliments for both of our musician groups, Shepherd's Pie and The Summerland Band with Tom Henderson. I was so pleased to see lots of people lingering, enjoying tacos and grilled cheese sandwiches from our vendor, ARCatering while listening to the music.

Prior to the festival, Terre was busy getting the word out via AAA's Westways magazine, the Independent, the Voice, the Scene and multiple on-line media sources. I received a phone call from a woman in La Canada who had seen our mention in Westways and was coming up to the festival. She wanted to be sure to see the painting demonstration, so she was verifying the time that would happen! Thank you to GVAA artist John Williams for another wonderful plein-air demonstration.

GVAA's November 2018 Juror Garrett Spier

"Italy in general, and Tuscany in particular, have motivated and challenged Garrett as an artist. In Tuscany, the past speaks as loud as the present. It is this contrast between the historic and contemporary, the cultural versus the natural, the geometry of the buildings verses the pitching hills, the wash of warm colors verse the cool blue of the shadows which cultivates his work. As an observer of Italian culture, he sometimes feels as though eminent collapse and chaos are just a moment away, yet within this imperfection, unity and cohesion exist. He would say this balance comes not in spite of this chaos, but because of it. They are inseparable. He feels his paintings describe a landscape that is in a state of flux, in the act of formation. Even as old and as weathered as the landscape is, it is still in a state of motion and transformation.

Most of his works were done Plein Air, working directly from nature, instead of from a secondary source such as a photograph. He believes Plein Air painting has many advantages, and more than a few disadvantages to the painter. He responds to the shifting light, the integrity of the colors, and the concentrated energy inherent when painting directly from nature. The disadvantages are that the light can shift in seconds, the weather can make the experience more like a winter camping trip, and colors once vibrant while outside, look like muted grays when seen inside.

Garrett received a BA in Fine Arts at the University of Utah, in painting and drawing and Master of Fine Arts at the Cranbrook Academy of Art, Bloomfield Hill, MI. He has worked in the art world for many years along with teaching. He has taught in NC, Georgia and Italy.

The Santa Barbara Art Association

Is Calling All Artists for Solo Show in Faulkner Side Gallery: The Santa Barbara Public Library will hold an ingathering on Saturday, November 10, 10am to 12:30pm for local artists to apply for a month long solo show in one of the Faulkner side galleries. The artists must pick up their pieces from 3-4pm the same day. One or more artists can apply together for a month's show if you feel you do not have sufficient inventory by yourself, but each artist must be juried. The jurors will select 20 artists for solo shows from July 2019 through May 2020, the month to be determined by lottery. This approach provides artists to fill the galleries for a year and makes this an annual event the artists can anticipate.

This ingathering is run by the SBAA for the library and similar to the SBAA New Members ingathering except that it is limited to 2-dimensional artwork and there is **no application fee**. Bring in 3 pieces in the same medium ready for hanging that relate to each other in style, theme, and subject as you would in a private show.

You are not eligible to participate if you already have been assigned a show in the 24 months prior to **May 2019**. If selected, you will need about 20 pieces to fill a side gallery and the artwork you display should be consistent with the 3 pieces you submitted, professionally framed, and labeled. There is a fee for the month you are assigned the gallery and additional fee for any reception you plan. If you have any questions, **call Jacqui at 805-564-7019**.
