As of December 11th, five pieces have been sold, with people expressing interest in others. Congratulations to Tia Blickley, Janet Hart, Carol Talley, Merith Cosden and Sue Fridley who each sold a piece! They have since replaced their original pieces with ones the same size so they fit in easily.

For all GVAA artists, if you have a sale in Dec.2022, at the GVL "Picassos for Peanuts," the buyer may take the piece and you may replace your original with one the same size. A handwritten tag for the new piece can be inserted in the plastic tag holder. GVAA artists are asked to donate 10% of sales to the Friends of the Goleta Library. Please note that takedown of the show is scheduled for Thursday, December 29th from 10 - 12 P M. Plan to pick up then, as the library cannot store your art.

GVAA had a successful Outdoor Holiday Art Show and Sale on November 26th (report is on page 3). Eighteen GVAA artists participated. Photos appear further on in the newsletter. We are pleased to be sending 10% of our net income from the show to the Friends of the Goleta Library.

Always needing to "make something", I started crafting over 50 years ago. At first I used resin, making trivets and other molded objects. Along the line I made and sold Holly Hobbie dolls, which later turned into a five-year career making and selling leaded stained glass ornaments and larger pieces at a weekly craft show outside of Los Angeles.

But it was moving to Santa Barbara in 1983 that led me to the arts through the wonderful Adult Ed program. One class led to so many more, always learning, always experimenting. One medium led to another, and I was enamored with the freedom of collage, the structure of assemblage, and the versatility of abstract painting and mixed media.

I love color and texture. My art is intuitive. Whether starting with paint or paper, I let the process lead me to the next step. The piece is finished when it feels right to me. Because I work in a non-objective way, a different response is elicited from each viewer.

I'm a member of **GVAA**, **SBAA** and was a member of **AAC** for years. Also, a founding member of "On & Off the Wall", a group of five artists showing locally for a long period of time. Through these groups I've made the most wonderful, lasting friendships.



Wayne Hoffman, Rick Stich, Karen Browdy and many others.











Kelly had two pieces accepted into the SCAPE show in December, "Devereux Slough Reflections" (now hanging in GVAA Picassos for Peanuts show) and "Upper Devereux Slough II." Three of her pieces, "Santa Barbara Botanic Garden", "Roses at the Mission", and "Snowy Egret", were juried into the Randy Higbee 6" Squared Online Show going on now through January 6 (you can see her work here:

Kelly has 3 pieces in the Faulkner Gallery until 12/23: "El Presidio", "Douglas Iris 'Canyon Snow'", and "San Marcos Foothills Saved!"; and two pieces in Gallery 113 until 1/3.

For the past eight years I have taught an Adult Ed class for the the Santa Barbara City College titled "Art Experiences and Conversation: for Older Adults". It's a bit of a mouthful, but basically it's an art appreciation/ art history class. We look at art works that are contemporary and historic from locally to world wide. I use a key note program that fills the entire computer or smart TV screen with the art works.

As well as lecture we have had local and Los Angeles based artists come on line and show their work, provide demonstrations, and talk about the development of their own art. Happily I have known GVAA member Holly Hungett for many years as a fellow instructor for the City College. She was happy to come (via zoom) to the class and show some of her work, talk about influences and explain techniques she uses. I was able to show her work, filling the entire zoom screen, so it was quite impressive. I got a lot of positive student feed back from both artists and art collectors in the class. Helene Glassman and Teri Santitate are both members of the class.

The class went on line at the beginning of COVID and I expected to return to in-person, but many people look at the art on their big screen TV's, while sitting in comfortable clothes. And because the class is 5:00 to 6:00 on Tuesdays, I can see many people having snacks and a glass of wine. So being home has worked out well with no driving after dark. The class for fall term is almost over but will begin again in January if anyone is interested in registering.

It's a wonderful opportunity to let more people know about GVAA, too.
