A Message from our President

As I write this letter, we are still mostly in lockdown mode, still practicing social distancing and just beginning phase two of business openings in California. We are all still adjusting to the "new normal" and wondering what will come in the future.

For GVAA, we have been advised by the Goleta Valley Library that they are closed through May which means our ingathering scheduled for May 29th was cancelled. They also let me know that if they opened in June and/or July, it would probably be limited and they might not be allowing any large group meetings. We will receive credit for any room rental fees paid. GVAA also has a picnic scheduled for July 11th and, as of right now, I can't

Title: Three Little Fishes

Medium: Monotype, chin-colle & mixed

medium $6 \times 7 \frac{1}{2}$

Three Little Fishies was the number one song in 1939, sung by Kay Kyser and his Band (I like 30s and 40s swing music and play it on the uke and guitar. The song is also a kids song. I enjoy printing fish in the Japanese style of Gyotaku and have started making monotypes of fish and marine subjects using stencils to add to the work. Utilizing a gel plate and Golden Open acrylics. I used a Siamese Fighting Fish stencil for the center element and then add stencils of carp I had from another piece. Once I made the print, I had three fish shapes and started

humming the song. I have sheet music that has been tinted so I took another stencil of trout cut them out and decided to add them ala chine-colle. Finally, I decided to add detail to the center fish with a brush and ink and the result is "Three Little Fishies,"and they swam and swam right over the dam. I did several in different color palettes and this one seemed the most restful. As a printmaker I can make more than one "original" because each piece is always slightly different from the other so it is an original in its own right.
