Tips & Techniques

White and Black as Colors

We generally think of white and black as having no color. But white and black pigments are, in fact, colors – very light and very dark colors, respectively.

White has the lightest value of any color on your palette. White paints belongs to one of the six hue families; specifically, it is a very low chroma yellow. There are four kinds of white paint that you will commonly come across; titanium white, flake white (also known as lead white), Cremnitz white, and zinc white. Each has its own characteristics. Titanium white – an opaque white that dries relatively fast and has really good tinting strength – is the most common and versatile of all the white paints. Flake white is fast drying but has a lower tinting strength than titanium; its consistency is stiff, which makes it great for impasto. Cremnitz white is a great alternative to flake white. I primarily use titanium white, and I recommend that you stay away from zinc white, because it dries to a brittle film that will cause your paint to become unstable over time.

Black has the darkest value on your palette, and that should guide your use of it. Reserve black for the darkest darks in your work, such as crevice shadows. Like white pigment, black pigment has a hue. If you add titanium white to mars black, ivory black or lamp black, you will see that each of the blacks is really a very deep violet-blue. Therefore, treat any of these blacks as a very dark violet-blue color and use it only when mixing the darkest cool colors.

You can mix your own black paints, for instance by combining very dark colors like alizarin crimson and ultramarine. By mixing your own, you can add a touch more color to your blacks.

It doesn't matter if you're a painter, photographer or graphic artist. If you create an original image, you can sell it on FineArtAmercia, one of the oldest and best-established print-on-demand sites. FineArtAmerica encourages artist to sign up and upload their work to be sold on everything from prints to puzzles. The site does the work. It markets your art through the website and a smart phone app that shows your image on everything from a 3-D framed canvas to T-shirts, mugs, shower curtains and phone cases. You can even decide to offer it on tote bags, towels or yoga mats and has just introduced 'stickers' with your art work on it, sizes 2" x 2" and 6" x 6" that will cling to small smooth surfaces and can easily be removed!! 
