### Meet Cathy Runkle

Our November Goleta Valley Art Exhibit juror is Cathy Runkle. :

*Cathy:* Art makes all the world come alive for me. I have always been fascinated by nature. To look, and to wonder were instilled in me by my father and my grandmother. All of the shapes, sizes, colors, light and beauty of the world that surrounds us—it's an Inspiration!

I'm a third generation artist. My Grandmother, Mormie Runkle, was a watercolor artist in Los Angeles during the 1930s, 40s and 50s. I never saw her paint, but I have some of her paintings and they influence me. I hear her say to me, "Get Painting!"

As far back as I can remember, my mother, Pam Runkle was sewing, doing embroidery, enamel on copper, printmaking, or painting and drawing. She created many contemporary works of art in oil pastels on paper.

I was fortunate that both of my parents encouraged my sister and me to be creative and artistic. My mom dropped us off at an art studio on Saturday mornings when I was very young. My parents proudly displayed our artwork around the house and on the refrigerator door.

I've always been captivated by illustrations in children's books and at a very young age loved the works of N.C. Wyeth, Maxfield Parrish, Norman Rockwell and Alphonse Mucha. I enjoyed learning to draw because of the influence of these artists.

### Jerilynne Nibbe

Art has been one of Jerilynne's passions since junior high school when her father, a sign painter, taught her brush lettering. Her love of letter forms can be seen in many of her monotypes.

Jerilynne received her B.S. in art education from Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana. Subsequently, she taught art in middle school and adult education programs in both Indiana and California. After twenty-four years of teaching studio art and digital imaging, she retired from Crane Country Day School.

During her time at Crane, she was awarded a fellowship to study printmaking. She spent a month at the Graphics Workshop in Santa Fe, New Mexico, exploring monotype and Chine collé with Ron Pokrasso. In the Chine collé process



thin papers are glued during the printing. Since then she has done extensive work with Chine collé adding her drawings and rice papers to her prints.

Over the years she has worked in a variety of mediums including calligraphy, ceramics, monotype, watercolor, woodcuts, and computer graphics. A local workshop at the Rusty Barn renewed her interest in woodcuts. Her new body of work is producing a variety of colorful prints by combining woodcuts with Chine colllé.

During the pandemic, Jerrylynne felt that Art was her savior. She gathers new ideas on the Internet, and explores new







media by visiting online museums and watching YouTube videos. Recently she began experimenting with alcohol inks and acrylic pouring.

Devoting her time to making art and taking a more active part in shows and exhibits around town, Jerilynne exhibits regularly with Goleta Valley Art Association, Santa Barbara Art Association, and Santa Barbara Printmakers. She has won many awards and had several one-person shows; the most recent was at the Morro Bay Library.

A major influence in Jerilynne's life has been her husband and fellow artist, Loren Nibbe. He has always given her his unfailing support, encouraging her to grow as a person and an artist.

As my Mixed Media class proceeds, I am beginning to have a collection of gel print backgrounds to play around with. My sister has an October birthday and I always enjoy sending her a handmade card. That's what inspired this ghoulish gourd guy!

The black outlines are another form of simple printmaking called blot printing (some lines got out of control, but it seems to add to the creepiness). The figure and gourds are a freehand drawing I made on tracing paper, then inked and blotted onto a gel-printed background. The figure and gourds were highlighted with some acrylic paints.
