As a child, I was interested in drawing, coloring, and finger painting, but as a long time teacher of young children in Montessori schools I regard that as normal childhood behavior. During my 8th grade art class, I could never finish anything on time, so I never finished anything. I decided then that I wasn't cut out for a career in art. But my interest in visual art continued.

In college I took as much art and architecture history as was available, and visited the Art Institute of Chicago whenever possible. After college, my wife and I visited as many fine art museums as we could while traveling, as well as making sure we saw shows featuring local artists.

When I was about fifty, arthritis forced me to stop exercising like a maniac every day. I was at a loss for how to fill my time. My wife says I was depressed. Somehow I landed on taking up art, naively thinking, "Oh, I can do that."

My wife generously gave me a very nice set of watercolors, paper, brushes, and ten private lessons with a local professional artist whose work I had long admired. A friend who is an artist confidently told me it would take ten years for me to become an artist. Within six months I had given up watercolor and at ten years I was not anywhere near being able to consistently make good paintings.

Yet, there must have been enough positive feedback along the way, because I kept at it. I failed in my first try at getting into the SBAA and was so discouraged I didn't try again for several years. GVAA accepted me in 2008. I later joined SCAPE and began to occasionally exhibit in their benefit shows.

When I retired after forty years of teaching, I knew that I would have the opportunity to paint every day. That, and joining a studio class, certainly helped me become a better painter.

Giving up on trying to paint with watercolor, I switched and stuck with oils, except when collaborating with my sister on a painting. She paints abstract art in acrylic, doesn't like to plan, and goes fast.

I'm still the plodding worker, and have been since my early days. But I'm able to



finish most of my paintings, and to meet deadlines for shows.

About a year ago I was invited to become a member of The Oak Group. I've exhibited in two of the group's shows and look forward to more exhibits with the group. Last May, I had the happy and nerve wracking experience of getting to produce art to advertise the May exhibit. That privilege goes in alphabetical order and my name just happened to come up next in the order.

I think, sincerely, I am most happy to be a member of the GVAA, the first art association to which I was admitted. I'm looking forward to exhibiting with GVAA for as long as I can.
