IN 1970 I moved to Santa Barbara

to attend UCSB, where I was fortunate to study drawing with Howard Warshaw, a well known muralist and figure painter. Later under his guidance, I earned an MFA in drawing. Drawing, especially figure drawing became my passion.

Some years passed; I began teaching painting and drawing at Santa Barbara City College and, toward the end of my teaching career, at the Continuing Education Department known as Adult Ed. I hadn't planned on teaching but it turned out to be a good fit and ultimately lasted 36 years!

During this time, I continued painting and drawing, attending workshops and classes, and weekly figure drawing sessions.

About ten years ago I discovered plein air landscape painting. Since that time I've continued to go out weekly and paint on location with a few friends. These small studies, done within a couple of hours, are like going to the gym for your painting

skills! The time spent in the field looking and reacting is invaluable. One learns to compose, mix color, create a sense of light, mood and place, and ultimately trust your intuition. Besides that, it's just fun to be painting outside!

I think of myself as a naturalistic painter rather than a realistic one. I'm free to interpret and change information if the painting needs it. My goal is to make a well crafted painting that speaks to the viewer about place, time of day, lighting and weather conditions.

The world is a beautiful place and landscape subjects worthy of painting can be found near or far. I live across from Lake Los Carneros and paint there often. I hope my Santa Barbara paintings, the familiar trees, rocks, cliffs and seascapes.

will enable people to appreciate the beauty I see.

I enjoy combining travel and painting too! It's always nice to get out and paint something unfamiliar, to stretch your skills. My husband and I have a four-wheel drive truck with a camper on it and we like to get out to unpopulated spaces: deserts, mountains, coastlines. The western states offer such variety.

Recently I returned from a three week painting trip in Southwestern France, near the Pyrenees. Every day our small group would go to a different tiny village to paint and explore. I came back with a group of paintings whose subject matter is very different from what I usually look for. This was often frustrating, but I learned a lot and came home with the best souvenirs!

July 11, 2022 Dear Elizabeth,



SEPTEMBER Special GVAA Event

On September 30th, Christina Ramos is offering an in-person 4 hour painting class in Goleta. This class covers the basics of painting with acrylics. Whether you are a beginner or an experienced painter, this is the class for you. Learn fundamental techniques used by the instructor, to create realistic images. Each student will have individual attention, and the instructor will demonstrate all the techniques used to

paint a small still life. Paints and reference material will be supplied by the instructor. Students will bring brushes and one 11x14 canvas as well as a table top or standing easel.

Jim Felland

Born in Chicago, Jim Felland grew up in Indianapolis. He says: My artistic beginning was at age 8. After entering a third grade poster contest, my appetite for art work was initiated by my entry winning 1st place.

Through my public school years I would doodle, draw, paint and otherwise create as I found it satisfying to express myself and how I viewed the world. When in high school, I participated in all available art classes and their various mediums.


Attending Ball State in Muncie, I was given further experiences and challenges in the art world and my vision grew. Under the tutelage of a gifted art director, Dr. A. Nichols, I worked in oil, sketched with ink, formed sculptures, created mobiles. The scope of my vision was enhanced after joining the Army as a staff photographer, spending two years in Germany.

Upon becoming a civilian again, I became a newspaper and freelance photographer that added width and depth to my view of life and this world.

At retirement, I realized a new approach in art that gave life to watercolor. With numerous Adult Education classes and various talented instructors, I added pen and ink to my medium. A four-week stay in Norway added to my love of nature, color and form. The most recent addition to my works came from a threeweek visit in Santa Fe, New Mexico.

A member of Santa Barbara Art Association and Goleta Valley Art Association, my art has been shown at Goleta Valley Library, and Santa Barbara Art Association shows at the Faulkner Gallery in the Central Library. The Santa Barbara Maritime Museum, Cabrillo Bath House and Hutton Foundation in Goleta/ Santa Barbara also have included my work. A one time show at the Santa Barbara County Fair at Earl Warren gave me the opportunity to participate in ten separate categories as well as the International Orchid show in the past.

I will be having a solo show in the Faulkner side gallery at the Santa Barbara Central Library during November, 2022.



Courthouse Fund Raiser

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. - The Great Arch at the landmark Santa Barbara County Courthouse entrance is in need of restoration, and artists are selling their works to help with the fundraising. An online art sale is benefiting the Santa Barbara Courthouse Legacy Foundation. The non-profit says, any artwork that is sold will be split 50/50 with 50% to the artist and 50% to the Courthouse Legacy Foundation.

Over the years, the foundation says "The magnificent Santa Barbara Courthouse is deteriorating from age, environment, and public use." The County of Santa Barbara is responsible for the general maintenance of the Courthouse but does not have the artistic resources or funds to authentically restore this magnificent structure.

The role of the Courthouse Legacy Foundation is to find the funding and expertise to implement conservation activities at the Courthouse that the County cannot pursue.

"The sale will be courthouse paintings in oil, watercolor, pastel and acrylic as well as photographs of the exterior and interior of the beloved building," the foundations says.

Angelique Davis with the Courthouse Legacy Foundation says, "It is a magnificent structure. It is an icon of Santa Barbara. It is a stunning, big building for sure."
